The truck will be used to transport material and equipment from Monrovia to the campus.






Ongoing Project

The walls are to memorialize our loved ones. The donation is \$50 for each deceased person.


Phase 2 is started.




The library is not complete.

Langford Hall (Boys' Dorm)


Reopening St. John's & House of Bethany (Boarding)
